2022 Individual Regionals

Today's competition is the first step in crowning the 2022 IHSA Individual and Team State Champions in Wrestling as 16 Class AAA Regional Tournaments are being contested throughout the state. The top 3 individuals at each weight will qualify for a spot in one of 4 Individual Sectionals Tournaments that will be held throughout the state next Friday and Saturday. Top 3 place winners in today's tournament will compete next Friday and Saturday at Barrington High School

In addition to the advancement of wrestlers in individual competition, the top scoring team will earn a spot in the Dual Team Sectional Tournament which will be held Tuesday, February 22 at Stevenson.

Keeping Team Score

If a wrestler wins . . .

*his first round match, he will earn 2 advancement points for his team.

*his semifinal match, he will earn 2 advancement points as well as 10 more points since he has at least 2nd place wrapped up.

*his championship match, he will earn 4 team points.

*his first round consolation, he will earn 1 team point.

*his consolation semifinal, he will score 1 advancement point, plus 4 team points since he has wrapped up 4th place.

*his 3rd place match, he will earn 3 team points.

Bonus points

*If a wrestler wins by a major decision (+8 to 14 points), he will earn an extra team point.

*If a wrestler wins by a technical fall (+15 or more points), he will earn and extra 1.5 team points.

*If a wrestler pins his opponent (or wins by default), he will earn an extra 2 team points.

If a wrestler receives a bye in the first round of the championship round, he does not earn team points. However, if he wins his semifinal match, it is as if he won his first round match by the same score. If his semifinal win is by a regular decision, 2 more points will be added to his team's score. If he wins by a major decision in the semifinals, 3 more points will be added to his team's score. If he wins by a technical fall, 3.5 more points will be added to his team's score. If he pins, 4 more points will be added to his team's score.

If a wrestler receives a bye in the first round of the consolation round, he does not earn team points. However, if he wins his consolation semifinals match, it is as if he won his first round consolation match by the same score.

Finals format

The north mat will be the championship mat. The south mat will be the 3rd place match. We will award medals for the top 3 place winners at the end of the tournament (but we will introduce the 4th place finishers as well). All top 4 place winners should remain in uniform and wear their mask for the award stand ceremony.

What if two teams tie for the team title, what determines who wins the title?

1. The team whose wrestlers or team personnel has been penalized the greater number of team points for flagrant misconduct or unsportsmanlike conduct shall not win the title.

2. The team with the most coach's misconduct penalties will not win.

3. The team whose wrestlers were penalized the greater number of match points for unsportsmanlike conduct shall not win the title.

Today's Team's History in the IHSA State Series

This tournament was called the Districts until 1980 when it changed to the current name of Regionals. Before 1984 the Team State Champion was determined by team points at the Individual State Tournament. Beginning in 1984 there were no longer official points kept at the Individual State Tournaments, all team state placing was done in the Dual Team State Series.

Waukegan has by far the most success in post-season history. The Bulldogs have won 26 Regionals (called Districts until 1980), though their last one was in 2001. The Dual Team competition began in 1984. Waukegan has qualified 4 times, taking 2nd in 1991, 4th in 1992, 1994, and 2001. Waukegan was one of the top programs in the state for many years, winning Individual State Titles in 1958, 1963, 1964, and 1966. Other placing years are 1951 (2nd), 1952 (2nd), 1957 (3rd), 1959 (3rd), 1960 (3rd), 1962 (2nd), 1965 (3rd), 1970 (3rd), 1972 (3rd), and 1982 (3rd).

Waukegan has had 74 All-Staters with 32 State Champions. Rick Bay, the son of long-time Waukegan head coach Ott Bay won 3 titles (145 in '59, 154 in '60, 1954 in '61). Coach Bay's other two sons also won a state title, Steve (138 in '63) and Mike (165 in '66). 15 year Libertyville head coach Bob Billberg won a state title (285 in '62). Long time former Waukegan head coach Larry Tenpas won two state titles (145 in '51 and '52). Waukegan's last All-Stater was David Oliva who won a State title in 2002 at 215.

Grant has won 18 Regional titles. They qualified for the Dual Team State Tournament 6 times ('04, '06, '07, '09, '13, '16), placing 3rd in the state in 2006. They have 48 All-Staters including three time champion Lee Munster (119 in '07, 171 in '09, 189 in '10). Steve Welter (133 in '64, 138 in '65) and Jimmy Kennedy (103 in '04, 125 in '05) were two time champions. Grant's last All-Stater was Justin Warmowski who placed 4th in state last season.

Libertyville has won 31 Regional titles. They have qualified for the Dual Team State 7 times ('86, '89, '02, '05, '08, '10, '14) placing 4th in 2008. They placed 4th in the Individual State in 1976. They have had 34 All-Staters with 3 State Champions; Dan Holm (145 in '71), Greg Gulsvig (185 in '76), and Mike Baumann (119 in '91). Libertyville had four All-Staters last season, including 2nd in state Chase Baczek.

Mundelein has won 8 Regionals titles, their last one in 1985. They have had 19 All-Staters. Although they haven't had a State Champion, they have had 3 state runner ups; Dan Wagemann (155 in '71, Jim Wagemann (167 in '72), and Norman Hays (185 in '86). Mundelein's most recent All-Staters was in 2018 when two Mustangs reached the podium; Dane Durlacher (3rd at 106) and Logan Kvien (4th at 182).

McHenry has won 6 Regional titles. They have had 13 All-Staters, their top finishers were Eugene Wilson (1954), Alan Wilson (1997), and Wade Lardy (2013). McHenry's last All-Stater was Brody Hallin who place 4th in state last season.

Warren won their only Regional title in 1988. They have had 12 All-Staters including two State Champions; Russ Schneider (145 in 1964) and Craig Murphy (103 in 1966). Warren's last All-Stater was last season when Joel Vandervere placed 3rd at 120.

Round Lake won their only Regional title in 1990. They have had 7 All-Staters, their top finisher being Amador Estrada taking 2nd at 103 in '96. Estrada is Round Lake's last All-Stater.

Zion-Benton has not won a Regional title. They have had 7 All-Staters. Their top finisher was Jim Winston taking 2nd at 154 in 1964. John Trice is their only two time All-Stater, his highest finish was 3rd at 138 in 1975. Zion-Benton's last All-Stater was in 2020 when Jordan Chisum placed 3rd.
